The Missouri Information Analysis Center's State of Missouri 2024 Theat Assessment (MIAC) assesses with medium confidence two forms of extremism that present a threat in the State of Missouri. These threats are domestic violence extremists, homegrown violent extremists and lone actors. Identifying a useful approach through which intelligence collected on radicalization can shed light on the changing nature of the threat. This will put law enforcement in a better position to assess the near and long-term risk that violent extremism poses. This training is based on the National Counter Terrorism Center's research in the area of radicalization and mobilization. These indicators were developed and updated based on a review of information derived from dozens of FBI terrorism investigations, peer reviewed academic studies, and analytic exchanges among intelligence community and law enforcement professionals.

This course will be taught by Deputy Raoul Williams, a retired Senior US Probation Officer Specialist with the Eastern District of Missouri. He is currently a Deputy Sheriff for the Franklin County Sheriff's Office and is responsible for developing, implementing, and expanding the intelligence capabilities of the organization. As a Threat Assessment Specialist, is a Law Enforcement and Terrorism Liaison to the Missouri Information Analysis Center (MIAC), a liaison to the St. Louis Fusion Center/Terrorism Early Warning Group. He is also a member of the Executive Board of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Joint Terrorism Task Force. Additionally, he is a member of the FBI's Regional Behavioral Assessment and Consultation Team.
